

Kingfishers learnt all about different renewable energy types and then all about biodiversity and the considerations that need to be made when creating these solar parks to protect plant and animal life. They designed their own solar parks with biodiversity considerations, that BSR have taken back to inspire future projects and they all loved making solar powered circuits too!

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





## **Talking Mental Health**

Thank you and Well Done to Joshua from Falcons and Elowen from Robins and their families who recently took part in the Doulting village 'Great British Spring Clean'.






In this time of all trying to do our bit to look after our planet, please turn your car off when waiting in the car park and on the roads around Doulting.
