Year 1 Nightingales have also made a great start to building on their maths knowledge from last year. They have enjoyed singing songs to help them learn their number facts.

Last week they worked on some problem solving to answer the question 'How many legs are there altogether?' based on the animals from a story they shared together.















Year 2 Magpies have been challenging themselves to share their 'What Makes Me The Me I Am?' balloons and 'Special People' writing with Year 6. They were buzzing afterwards with excitement and pride.

Mrs Barton delivered a mysterious case to the classroom. It was addressed to Year 2 but she did not know who it had come from. We looked inside and used the clues to think about who it belonged to.





Ask your child what they thought. Who did they think it belonged to? Why did they think that?



Year 2 have been enjoying their PE sessions, both indoors and outdoors. They have spent time practising their ball skills; particularly stopping and starting, rolling around the body and controlling when moving.











Year 3 Owls have been helping each other with kindness.

We have been enjoying our learning about Plants in Science. This week we have planned and set up an investigation to see how well plants grow in different conditions. How well will my plant grow ...?

## Year Four Finches



To help our understanding of place value, children worked in groups of 5 to represent 4 digit numbers in different ways. Children took on different roles including, making the number with concrete apparatus, drawing the number pictorially, writing it in digits and writing it in words. As part of our author study, Y4 have been reading The Iron Man. We used different shades and textures to create a collage of the Iron Man complete with bright, orange eyes.







We had a visit from a local dentist as part of our Science work on teeth and digestion. We learnt all about how important our teeth are, how to care for our teeth and what damages our teeth. The highlight for most was being able to brush a set of giant teeth with a giant tooth brush. The children listened well and asked thoughtful questions. Thank you to the volunteers who came in to talk to us. Y4 and Y1 got together to share some of their learning which has been going on during the first two weeks. Y4 particularly enjoyed reading some of their work to Y1 about what makes me, the me Lam



Year 4s have made an enthusiastic and positive start to their brass music lessons on Wednesdays. We are grateful to the Friends of St Aldhelm's PTA for supporting this opportunity for us this year. All children have been assigned instruments and are starting to make some great sounds. Keep up the good work!



#### Maths Problem Solving in Year 5

We worked in groups to solve a number problem. We needed to work systematically to find all the possibilities. We all took on different roles and selected resources we felt would be the most useful. Lots decided to use number cards and others used Dienes.



#### What Makes Me the Me I Am?

Our work on this mini-project led to a class share. We paired up with Year 3 and shared all of our work that explained and showed what makes us who we are. We shared artwork, pieces of writing, photos, our proud clouds and presentations. We were able to find out lots of new things about each other.







Year 6 are developing their focus during learning and demonstrating and applying this during sessions. There have been some excellent break-throughs in realising what they can do at this level if they put their minds to it. We look forward to seeing the children work towards and reach their individual potential as we move through this year. Fantastic start Year 6!

A big well done to all the children who received certificates for attendance during the whole of the last academic year and for the summer term!

Congratulations to each child that has received a certificate from their class teacher this month. It was wonderful to share these with so many parents at our first celebration assembly yesterday.
