On October 17th, teachers planned and led learning in a variety of subject areas in our wonderful outdoor environment:

- Reception and Year 1 children used our school forest school area for an Autumn scavenger hunt
- Year 2 explored problem solving in maths around the school playground and field
- Year 3 set off to the site of the well spring in the village to investigate soil
- Year 4 went on a walk through the village, using their senses to fully appreciate what was all around them
- Year 5 went across the glebe land to the woodland area to apply numerous maths skills to build shelters, show amazing collaboration and revealed some budding engineers and architects in the making
- Year 6 created natural art pictures in the school grounds






GLOBAL WORSHIP UPDATE:

Parent Voice – October 2019

A second Parent Voice session was held at school last month to provide an opportunity for parents to share their views on school matters. The following topics were discussed:

Things parents feel we are doing well...

- ClassDojo platform
A chorus of 'I love it!' "In Reception so much was put on Tapestry and this is great because this follows on." "KS1 messages can communicate small queries which are dealt with straight away."
- Parents had heard about the new behaviour rules (ready, respectful, safe) from their children. A copy of the policy would be good for information.
- Great to see so many photos of children at school in the newsletter, on ClassDojo and on Tapestry
→ Behaviour policy to be sent out to parents. **This was sent out by email on 16th October 2019**

Things parents feel we could improve...

- Playground at lunchtime – are issues passed on to teachers?
The observation slips that we use between lunchtime staff and teachers were discussed but this does need some work around consistency. Parents were happy to know this process is in place.

Website is in process and will be ready to launch before the Christmas break. At the last parent voice – people wanted to see more photos of the children and an up to date calendar. They would also like to know that up to date policies will be on website. All of these points will be on the new website.

Parent Governor Vacancies There are two vacancies and we do need and value parent representation.

- Letter sent out to parents with role and responsibilities information and an application form. A current governor (who is also a parent) was at Parent Voice and shared rewards are immense especially if your children are in school. **Two parents have subsequently been elected.**

Other areas

- It would be good to know what the focus areas are in class so we could help out a bit more to support at home. Welcome letters from the Class Welcome Meetings and the class sections of the website provide information about class learning in core areas and enquiry projects. There is also an overview of the whole year.
- In the mornings it gets a bit congested by Year 2 and Year 3. This could cause an accident. Can parents wait in the playground, not on corner and ensure there is a clear path through for those joining other classes.
- Celebration Worship changes. From previous feedback, some parents could never come so we have scheduled some Celebration Worship to take place on a Thursday, not always a Friday. Other days may be considered in future. In Monday class worship children can share outside awards. This will enable us to value the children and what they achieve more appropriately and fully.
- "Parents need to be ready, respectful, safe in church." Reminder to parents to stand to sing, needs some parents to lead by example. Nice to see a good split of children leading throughout the year.
- The School Development Plan and the School Evaluation Form are two important school documents that share what we offer as a school, what works well and things to celebrate, and things to improve. The Parent View is very important and feeds into these documents. Parents feel there are so many positives and that these need to be shared. "Parents should big up the things they love and feel able to vocalise these and concerns should be raised by parents to the school as soon as possible."
- Communicate to parents that external celebration awards can be brought on Mondays.
- Library Summer Reading Challenge – will be shared in October's Celebration Assembly
- Carry out a questionnaire in the Spring Term
- Parent Voice to be held on a different day at a different time on future occasions



St. Aldhelm's Governors

Another busy Autumn Term has brought changes to the Governing Board. You may have picked up that we started the term with co-chairs but ill-health meant that Patricia Hellier had to stand down. We are grateful to Wendi Davis for taking on the role of Safeguarding Governor in her place.

Last term, we outlined some of the roles and responsibilities of governors. You might like to see a few recent examples of the positive impact of our work on the children's learning and well-being:

- Governors have agreed to support the funding of new IT equipment in the Spring Term when the school's current contract runs out. Children and teaching staff will benefit from this investment in better technology.
- As part of the school's communication improvement and from responses of a parent survey, it was agreed to invest in a new, more user-friendly website. This will have the capacity to showcase the school more effectively and should be up and running before the end of term.
- The allocation of part of the Sports Grant to develop the new all-weather running track was supported by governors as part of the school's focus on healthy living.

Governors continue to support and challenge the school through regular visits, focused on different curriculum areas. It is a privilege to see the high quality teaching in action and to spend time with teachers and support staff who are so dedicated and keen to enable all the children in their care to be the best they can be. With Mrs Cohen, they deserve our thanks and appreciation for all that they do, especially as we move into December with all the extra demands of plays, carol services and parties.

The Board of Governors

Sue Bloomfield, Chair of Governors, Chair of Pay & Performance Panel

I've been a governor at St Aldhelm's for four years now, most of that time as Chair. My background is in education, most recently working in the Education Department at the Diocese of Bath and Wells. Investing in our children and their future has never been more important.
