Special Educational Needs and



Disabilities

Sensory needs can occur when a child has difficulties receiving and responding to information from their senses. Children with sensory needs may find it hard to cope with things that trigger their senses, including sound, light touch, taste, or smell. We can all experience sensory needs at different times in our life. For children who experience these more regularly, trying a selection of activities everyday can help ease these needs.

Calming Activities

Press-ups on a wall: Count to 10. Repeat 3 times



Walk up the wall: Put feet flat on the wall and count to 10 before walking down the wall. Repeat 3 times.





Half press-ups from the floor: Push up from knees not from the feet.



Chair sit-ups: Place hands on seat of chair by thighs and lift bottom off seat of chair by straightening arms. Parent says, "Push." Then parent says, "Relax." Relax for a few seconds. Repeat 3 to 5 times.


Walk along a straight line without wobbling off it, eyes fixed on a spot ahead to help balance.

Parenting Support

As parents and carers, there are ways we can support our children to give them the best chance to stay mentally healthy. Encouraging and guiding a child to think about their own mental health and wellbeing are vital skills you can teach them from a young. age.

Listen

Regularly ask your child how they're doing, to help them get used to talking about their feelings, and know there's always someone there to listen.

Support

Pay attention to how your child is feeling or behaving and try to help them work through difficulties. It may not be easy facing challenging behaviour, but try to help them understand what they're feeling and why.

Stay Involved

Show interest in their life and what's important to them. It not only helps them value who they are but also makes it easier for you to spot problems and support them.

Parent Support

Parenting for a child can be tough at times. It's important to look after your own mental wellbeing, as this will help you support yourself while you are supporting others. Please click on the Young Minds picture to visit the website for further information, helpline and webchat.

Positive Routines

Try to have structure around regular routines, especially around healthy eating and exercise. A good night's sleep is also important, so have a fixed time for going to bed and getting up.
