








Reception Robins







Talking Mental Health

Our Top Tips

Give children creative outlets. Creativity is a natural way for us to learn and express ourselves. This could be through games, art, writing, dance, photography etc.

Create a plan / new routine. Plan out what will be happening either a couple days at a time or for each week. Encourage exercise. Getting active can really boost and help regulate our mood. This could be just going for a short walk.
